



TREATMENT

PRIMARY DRUG FOR PEOPLE ADMITTED FOR TREATMENT THROUGH COCA FUNDING



The above chart shows the primary drug of use for individuals admitted for treatment through COCA funding during fiscal year 18/19. As our nation continues to struggle with the opioid epidemic, it is clear from the data above that people in Berks County are suffering from opioid use disorders at an alarming rate. Recently, the number of people reporting stimulants as primary drugs of choice has continued to rise.

WHAT IS TASC?

TASC (Treatment Access and Services Center) is a drug and alcohol central intake and treatment referral agency licensed by the PA Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs. COCA contracts with TASC to provide drug and alcohol assessment, treatment referral and recovery support services for Berks County individuals in need of public funds for addiction services.
